### State Officials Overwhelmingly Support Access to Justice Commission

Governor Polis signed HB23-1280 at a public ceremony officially codifying the Colorado Access to Justice Commission. The bill enjoyed near-unanimous bipartisan support in both chambers of the Colorado Legislature, passing the House 64-0 and the Senate 34-1. The bill, which was publicly supported by numerous community partners and government organizations, will pave the way for the ATJC to further its mission of expanding access, quality, and fairness in the justice system for all Coloradans.

#### BACA, E.D. OF COLORADO LEGAL SERVICES

Matt Baca, one of the Colorado Access to

Justice Commissioners, began in April as the Executive Director of Colorado's largest legal aid provider - Colorado Legal Services (CLS). CLS is a statewide nonprofit legal aid program that provides civil legal assistance to low-income individuals and seniors across Colorado. CLS offers free legal assistance in a range of areas, like family law, consumer protection, eviction defense, and services for survivors of serious crime and human trafficking.

### IAALS CREATES NATIONAL FRAMEWORK FOR ALLIED LEGAL PROFESSIONALS

The Institute for the Advancement of the American Legal System at the University of Denver announced the release of its new report, Allied Legal Professionals: A National Framework for Program Growth. As part of IAALS' Allied Legal Professionals project, the report includes multiple research-informed recommendations to help standardize a new tier of legal professionals across states, with the goal of increasing the options for accessible and affordable legal help for the public.

### COLORADO COURTS RECEIVE NATIONAL GRANT FOR EVICTION DIVERSION

The Colorado Judicial Department has been awarded a highly competitive grant to launch an eviction diversion pilot program in the 4th Judicial District (Colorado Springs). The grant, awarded by the National Center for State Courts, will establish a program that offers alternative solutions to housing problems and promote housing and financial stability. The Judicial Department will partner with legal, financial, and social service providers in El Paso and Teller Counties to advance housing security in an innovative approach to housing solutions.
